

The History of The Midterms, and How They Work



The midterms in the United States are always held on the first Tuesday of November every 2 years. It is about the midpoint of the presidential term. All of the seats in the United States House of Representatives are up for grabs, and 33 or 34 senate seats depending on the year. The founders of our country established Congress through the Constitution in article one section one, ""All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives."" That was ratified on July 7, 1776.

The Constitution also said that there shall be a governor in each state. A fun fact about governors is that Vermont and New Hampshire elect their governor every two years instead of the normal 4 years that every other state has. During the midterms 36 governors are up for election. Many states also pick state legislatures during the midterm elections. In 2018 there are more than 1,000 state, local, and federal elections.

Usually the midterms are not very good for the party in charge. For example in 1938, while one of the greatest Democratic presidents (Franklin Delaware Roosevelt) was in office, the Democrats lost 7 whole seats in the Senate. Another example is in 1986, president Ronald Reagan, a president who most Republicans believe is one of the greatest presidents lost 8 seats in the Senate. Now there is a president (Donald Trump) with the lowest approval rating in the history of the United States. Currently with only a few days left until the election, the Republicans are expected to keep control in the Senate. But the Democrats are expected to takeover the House for the first time since 2008.

Finally I will leave you with these two quotes on voting from two great presidents: "Democracy cannot succeed unless those who express their choice are prepared to choose wisely. The real safeguard of democracy, therefore, is education." -Franklin D. Roosevelt. "Either you will control your government, or government will control you."" - Ronald Reagan
